The Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Stafford Act)

- Is a 1988 United States federal law designed to bring an orderly and systematic means of federal natural disaster assistance for **state and local governments in carrying out their responsibilities to aid citizens.**
- The Stafford Act is a 1988 amended version of the Disaster Relief Act of 1974. It created the system in place today by which a presidential disaster declaration or an emergency declaration triggers financial and physical assistance through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). **The Act gives FEMA the responsibility for coordinating government-wide relief efforts**

- FEMA's rapid deployment of first responders to support emergency relief may result anytime commercial fuel is in short supply. In order to provide critical fuel support during disasters and emergencies and in response to validated requirements submitted by FEMA, DLA Energy established contract to support.
- DLA Energy established contract with commercial fuel contractor to provide delivery of aviation, ground fuel and bulk propane to locations designated by FEMA in event of natural or man-made disasters or emergencies.
- DLA/FEMA Interagency Agreement (IAA), Annex B ironed out fuel support provisions.

FEMA Contingency Fuels Contract (cont.)

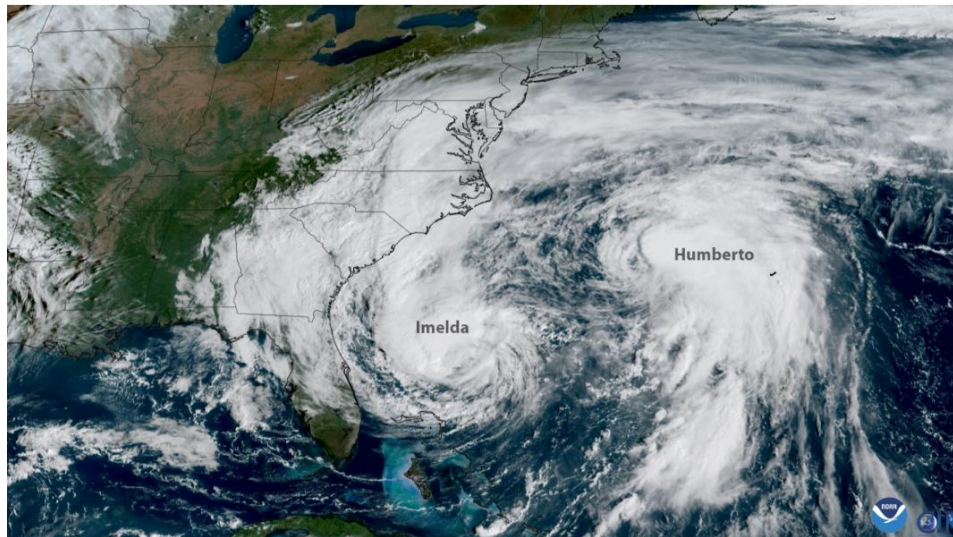


FEMA requires fuel for first responder's support

- Ground products (Diesel and Mogas), Jet (JAA), and Bulk Propane, NEW (Diesel Exhaust Fluid -DEF). NEW (AVGAS)
- Able to do both bulk and retail (to include Barge support).
- CONUS (lower 48), Alaska, Hawaii, Guam, American Samoa, Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), Puerto Rico, St. Thomas, St. John, St. Croix and USVI surrounding minor islands.
- Does not, by design, support T10 & T32. That is DOD's job!
- DLA Energy does the actual contracting on behalf of FEMA
 - Manages contract.
 - Provides C2 during execution, if tasked
 - FEMA makes all the funding and prioritization decisions.
- Current Contract:
 - 2 Prime Vendors
 - Response times vary per location
