Integrated Materiel Manager – Commodities

- “DLA Energy: Enable mission readiness by providing globally resilient energy solutions to the Warfighter and Whole of Government.”
- Designated as the Integrated Materiel Manager (IMM) for Bulk Petroleum Products
 - Contract (FAR) Solutions
 - International Agreement Solutions
- Put fuel arrangement coverage in place with partnering militaries to mutually benefit both participants



Authority & Tools

- Primary Authority comes from DoD's Acquisition and Cross-Servicing Agreements (ACSA) with Partner Nations' Ministries of Defense.
- ACSAs are general in nature and provide the authority to conduct sales/purchases of logistical supplies, services, and support (LSSS).
- CCMD owns the ACSAs in their Area of Responsibility.
- The ACSA allows DLA Energy to implement fuel specific arrangements with military partners.
- ACSAs allow for multiple settlement options:
 - Equal Value Exchange (EVE): e.g., Diesel for Jet Fuel
 - Replacement in Kind (RIK): e.g., JP8 for JP8
 - Monetary Reimbursement



Authority & Tools

- Primary tools used are Implementing Arrangements and ACSA Orders.
- Implementing Arrangements detail specific responsibilities, procedures, quality specifications, and settlement options of a fuel sale or purchase.
 - Three types: Direct Bill, Fuel Exchange, and Fuel Support
- Support is non-binding, subject to partner availability and approval, disputes are settled between the participants.
- ACSA Orders - Used for short term/emerging fuel requirements.
- DLA Energy authors, negotiates, concludes, and executes implementing arrangements and administers ACSA Orders in support of U.S. DoD requirements.

Warfighter Support – Implementing Arrangements



Direct Bill Arrangements (DBA) & Fuel Exchange Arrangements (FEA) “Most Commonly Used”.

Enable worldwide retail fuel sales & purchases, subject to fuel availability and logistical constraints of providing nation.

DBA: Balances are settled monetarily.

FEA: Balances are offset gallon-for-gallon with remaining debt settled via RIK, EVE, and/or monetarily.

Warfighter Support – Implementing Arrangements



Fuel Support Arrangements (FSA) are primarily used for management of DLA Energy owned fuel within foreign military infrastructure. Can also be used to procure bulk fuel. Invoices typically settled monetarily.

Warfighter Support – ACSA Orders

ACSA Orders

Typically used for short-term fuel sale and purchase requirements (exercise, contingency operations). Open-ended up to 12 months in duration.

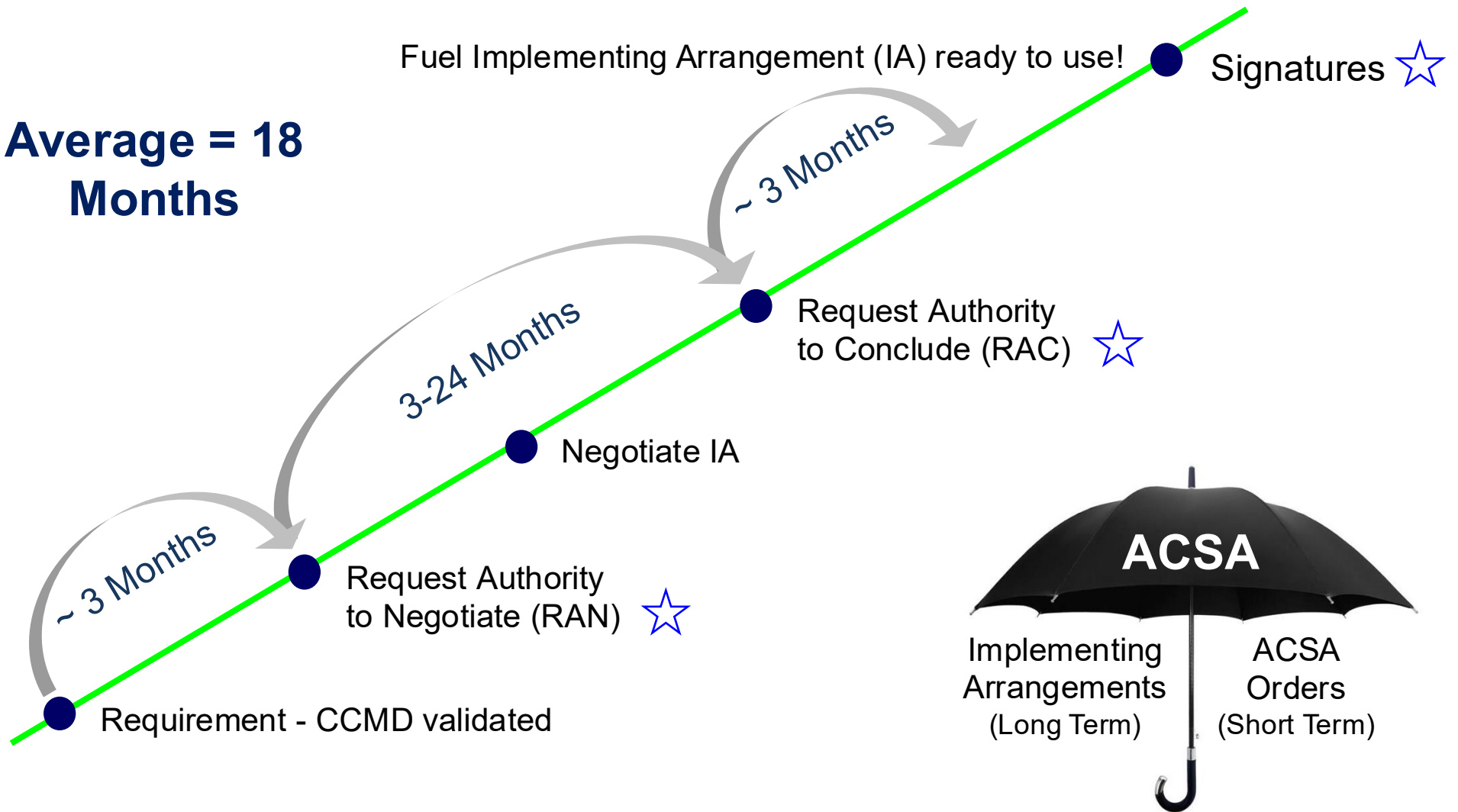

- Immediate fuel support during Humanitarian Assistance, Disaster Relief, Exercises, and Contingencies
- Provides **authority** to sell/purchase fuel between U.S. DoD/MOD
- Creates supply chain efficiencies and enhances interoperability
- Fuel Sales at the MIL-to-MIL price, **no taxes**
- Replacement in Kind (RIK) & Equal Value Exchange (EVE) settlement options - financial/operational advantages
- Invoice DLA Energy for all fuel sales to U.S. Military
- Includes Refuel at Sea (RAS) with Navy
- Includes Air-to-Air Refueling (AAR) with Air Force

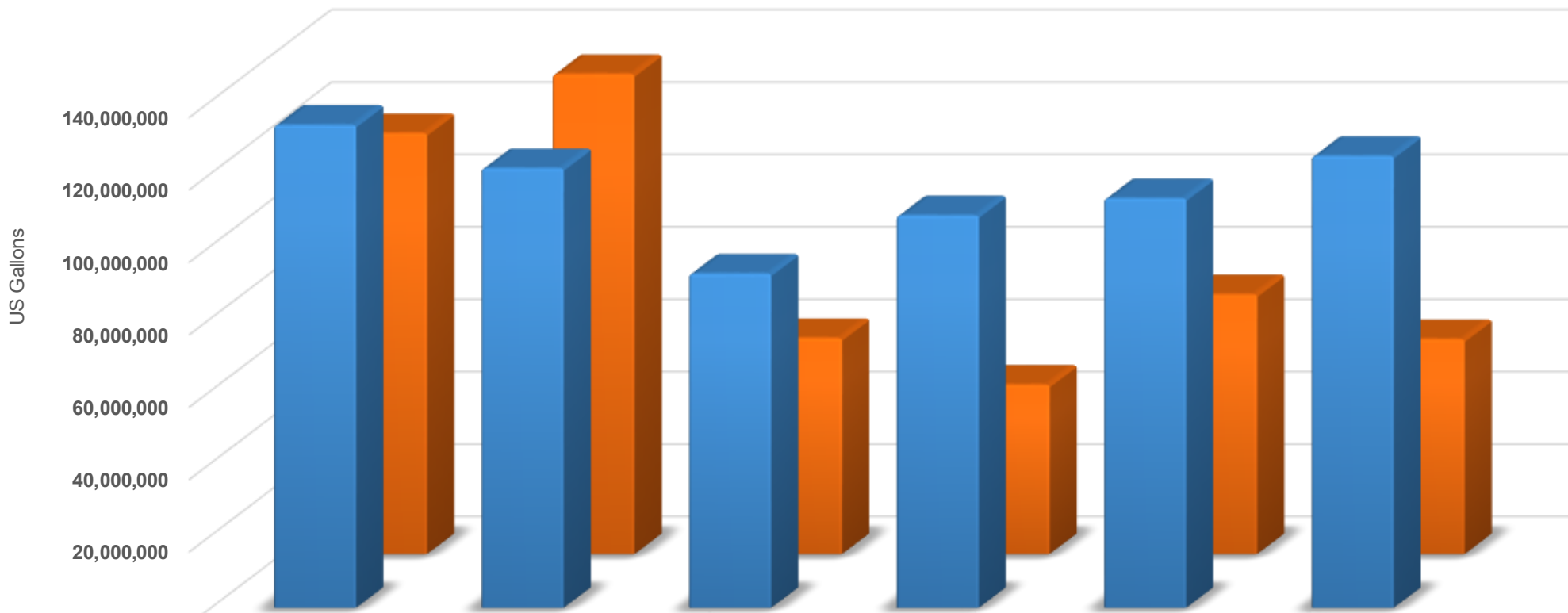
