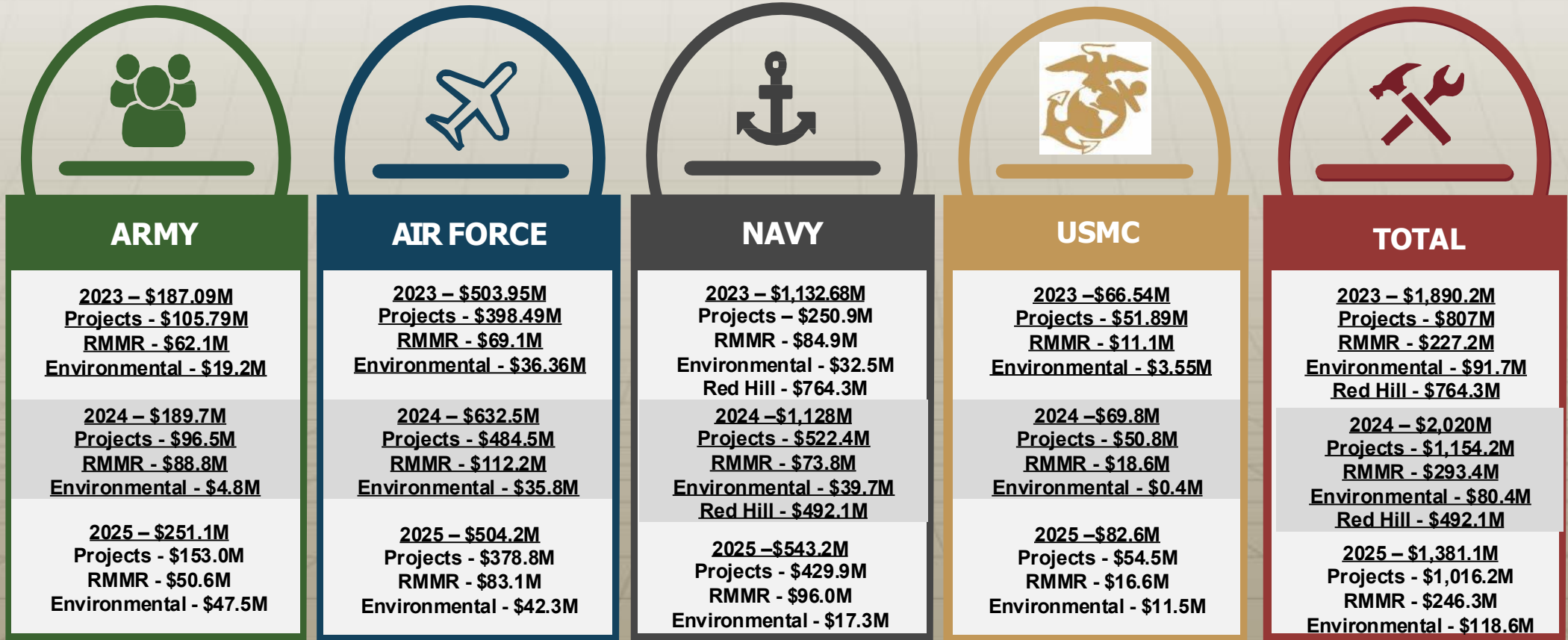

Navy Recurring Maintenance & Minor Repair Changes



Purpose: Provide recurring maintenance, inspections and minor repairs of the Petroleum, Oil and Lubricant facilities where DLA Energy is identified on the real property record as having the requirement for sustainment funding. Petroleum systems as defined refer to storage tanks, connected piping, ancillary equipment and facilities, containment systems, transfer and dispensing facilities.

Recurring Maintenance: Planned Preventative maintenance that happens repeatedly at regular intervals.

Minor Repair: Restoring a real property facility so that it may effectively be used for its primary purpose.

Five Phases: Planning, Programming, Acquisition, Execution, Close-Out

Intent: The RMMR Program is to ensure System level maintenance is performed. Complete minor repairs identified by the RMMR Contractor during RM visits or another Sustainment, Restoration, and Modernization Pillars.

Misuse: Goes against its intended purpose. Results in exceeding Contract Ceiling, Emergency Service Orders Only Status and Pulls funding from funding programmed requirements.

Centrally Managed Programs

- Leak detection, spill prevention and response exercises, environmental guide

Technical and Funding Support to Capitalized Fuels Facilities

- *Compliance* – sampling/analysis, waste disposal, permit fees, Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasure (SPCC) and Facility Response Plans
- *Restoration* – spill response, assessment and cleanup of capitalized fuel; 113 active remediation sites and 46 installations

Complete Management of Permitted Sites Planning Support

- Capitalization/Decapitalization, National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), Sustainment, Restoration, & Modernization (SRM)/Military Construction (MILCON) program support

Navy & USMC Leak Detection Overview



Program Mission

- Provide environmental regulatory compliance, pollution prevention minimization through routine testing, site evaluations reports and plans and fuel system optimization studies in support of Navy and Marine Corps facilities.

Scope:

- Leak Detection of the following assets:
 - Airport Hydrant Systems
 - Military Service Stations
 - Underground Storage Tanks (USTs)
 - Marine Loading Arms and Pier Pipelines
- Permanent Leak Detection Systems
- Designated Underground Storage Tank Operator Training (CA only)
- UST Operator Training

Per DoDM 4140.25, only DFSP real property assets properly recorded in the Service APSR and coded to DLA sustainment responsibility are eligible for DWCF sustainment funding. DFSP facilities are DWCF-capitalized energy commodity infrastructure supporting the receipt, storage, and issuance of DLA-owned bulk petroleum products throughout the DoD supply chain.
